

There will not be a run in January.


Kiwifruit and Ginger Cake

125 grams Butter
175 grams Sugar
2 Eggs
5 Medium Kiwifruit
2 teaspoons Baking Powder
1 tablespoon Boiling Milk
1 teaspoon Baking Soda
225 grams Flour
1 teaspoon Ground Ginger

Cream butter and sugar, add eggs. Next add mashed kiwifruit and the baking soda dissolved in boiling milk. Add sifted flour, baking powder and ginger. Bake in a 20cm greased cake tin and cook at 180 deg C for 45 minutes or until a skewer comes out clean. Ice when cold.
