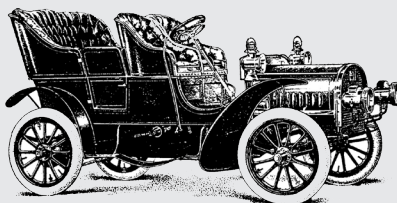

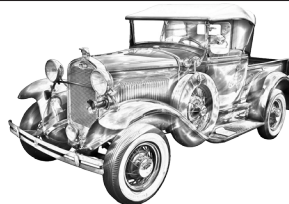

Compliancing our Vintage and Classics

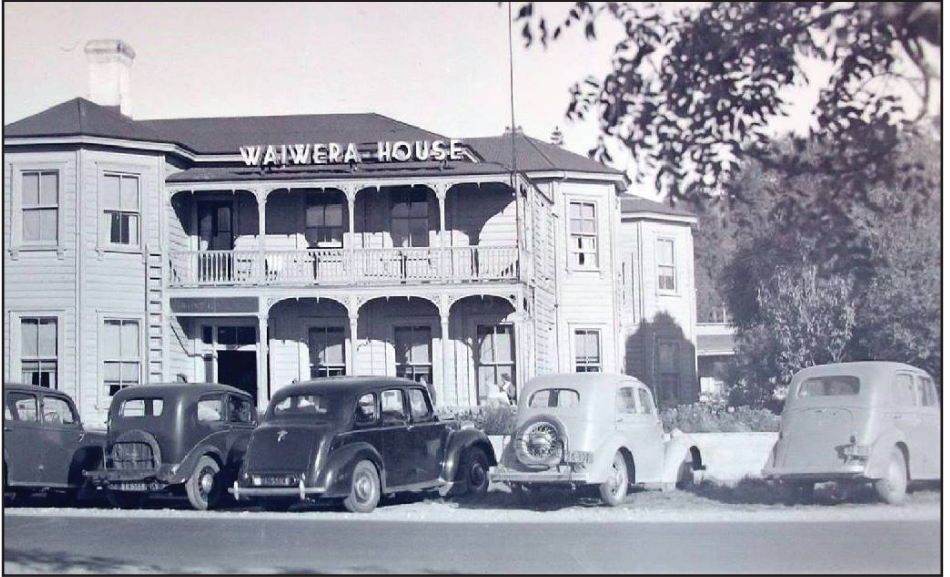
The VCCNZ club registrar is Rod Brayshaw. He advises that since 1999, the former LTSA now NZTA and the VCC negotiated a pre-registration document, namely The Date of Manufacture and Authenticity Statement (DOMAS) that sits within all new and any future safety rules for Historic Motor Vehicles in NZ, using our Vehicle Identity Card system to support these vehicles that have reached 30 years old and older, during any vehicle certification examination. Our VCCNZ system provides an effective "green path through the process".

Rod also advises that he is happy to get involved in supporting terminology and mechanical differences within all types of member's vehicles. He also stresses the importance of paper trails on owners and components.

The VCC NZ is a key member in the NZ Federation of Motoring Clubs (FOMC). They are looking at lobbying for 12 month WOF for vehicles older than 40 years.
