
CLUB CAR PHOTOS

Chairman's Report - April 2016

Thanks in particular to the small band of branch members who organised the Swap Meet, and the good weather on the day, I am pleased to say we have turned around a 5 figure deficit in 2014/15 into a very small surplus this year. That was even after spending almost \$4,000 on building maintenance. Not bad when you consider our levy income is only \$10 per full member, which is less than \$1000 per year, especially when total branch expenditure is more than \$30,000 per annum.

I remain hopeful that we can fill all committee positions in the new year, especially when you see we did so well with a relatively "green" committee with gaps in some of the important roles. Imagine how much better we can do this year if we have a full group contributing to the running of the branch.

Big savings have been made on this magazine in the last year too. From here on, even if we posted every magazine each month, our total annual cost including production and post will be under \$4500, after averaging \$8500 for the last 2 years. This has been in part achieved by not printing and posting issues to the other 35 branches, making it only available online to their members (which in essence has a wider viewership anyway). We hand out about 25 each club night on average, so the annual cost of Side Curtains should now stay under \$4,000.

The focus has been on spending wisely, making sure no important services or maintenance needs have been cut, while maximising the money inwards through our events. I really do hope the membership receives the financial report well at the AGM, as I am not sure under the circumstances such a turn around could have been expected, let alone achieved.

More than once in the last year I have been queried about committee minutes. If any member wants to see them as soon as they are approved at the next committee night, I will email them to you. Just let me know you want them.

My own personal spare time in the last month has been challenged by deciding to set up a retail showroom in Ngongotaha for my Hamilton based business which my partner Fleur will operate. I have spent almost every night and all weekends since mid-April building, painting, cleaning etc. I did manage to add another old Brit to my fleet (groan), with Fleur now driving a P38 Range Rover with a V8 petrol engine.

I also got a great big goodie bag of parts for a couple of my cars from the UK, and hopefully will to fit them all soon. As you will note elsewhere in this issue, the May Club run is a visit to a private collection, and it is a week later than usual.

The May midweekers also varies from the script a little in that there will be two runs on separated days as only limited numbers can take part.

The April Night Run was a great night with good food and a good run in pleasant weather, but was very poorly patronised. Perhaps we can find out why over the next couple of months and try and improve attendance next year. It was certainly an easy run, even in the dark, with no one getting lost.

Our "busy season" is coming up with prize giving in June, the Swap Meet in July, and the National VCC AGM here in August, as well as our Sulphur City rally.


The "Swap Meet Volunteers Board" is already up in the clubrooms, it makes a big difference if all branch members can contribute in one way or another. It effectively pays for more than half our operating costs, and keeps our individual branch levy down to \$10, when it would need to be \$150 or more without this event funding our continued operation. I hope we have a good turn out at the AGM, I want to personally thank all those that contributed in the past year, including the committee, the Swap Meet team, the Sulphur City team, those who contributed to our magazine and/or Beaded Wheels, and those who displayed vehicles at the Car Show.

It is important moving forward we provide activities our branch members and prospective new members want, and we can't do that without feedback. Please if you have something to say, talk to a committee member about it, or come along to the AGM and have your say. I hope to see you all there.

Midweek "Massey Ferguson" Run April 2016

After meeting at the clubrooms at 10am for a quick cuppa we set off under the guidance of Bob and Pat Mackay to the Waharoa Cheese Factory café for lunch.

Along the way we were followed for most of the distance by a tourist bus that kept getting ever so close to our rear end. We caught up to a little bit of traffic on the Highway 27 road and the speed slowed a little although we were still doing 95-100kph and this bus decided it was going to push us out of the way came within a meter of our rear end flashing its lights forcing me to move off the road, it shot passed and to our amazement was also towing a trailer!!!.

Anyway we made it to the lunch stop and all had a very enjoyable meal and then quickly moved on to the Glenfalls collection of Massey Harris/ Ferguson Tractors owned by John and Alison Walsh in Morrinsville. We were welcomed by John and Alison and John gave a very interesting talk on the achievements of Harry Ferguson, what an incredible man he was. His post war alliance with the Standard Triumph company not only created the Massey Ferguson tractor but also saved the company with tremendous post war growth.

As we walked through the collection John gave a brief talk on the history of each tractor in the museum. He has all the rarest models of the "T" range produced plus various models of the later very successful 35 series.

It was not only the tractors but the amount of Massey/Harris/Ferguson agriculture machinery that was built, right down to the 1898 bicycle. Almost every one of his T series had some kind of implement attached from ploughs to potato planters to the banana model front end loader all built by Massey Ferguson.

Probably one of the most significant inventions of Harry Ferguson was the 3 point linkage hydraulic Ferguson system. This system is still the basis of hydraulics used in pretty much all brands of to days modern tractors. The museum is not based totally on the number of tractors but more about the history on Massey/Harris/Ferguson and the popular "T' series which would arguably be the best and most popular Tractor ever built in the world. Following the collection we were introduced to the Massey Ferguson library and once again most of the material here is about the early years of Massey Ferguson.

I was very humbled by the fact John wanted to know the history of my tractor which is a TEA that I have owned for forty years and is still used on our small farm. He has a database that he hopes to eventually have the history of every "T" model in New Zealand. From memory I believe he already has about 1300 Tractors on this database which gives you some indication of just how popular these great tractors were and still are.

This collection of Massey Ferguson history is believed to be the biggest in the Southern Hemisphere and has a world wide following. It is an absolute credit to John and Alison Walsh.

Following the guided tour we were taken to the conference room upstairs for afternoon tea before heading home.

Im sure all enjoyed the day.

One of the first detours on the run was a ride through a Cambridge retirement Village, was great to see the waves and smiling faces.




It was then lovely winding back roads and beautiful countryside back to the clubrooms for afternoon tea. This was followed by a delicious evening meal and prize giving.
